2nd Sunday of Easter (Sunday of Divine Mercy)



A protestant pastor friend of mine was invited to meet Pope Francis with a group of other pastors. He noticed the Pope's chair was especially ornate and set at the head of the group. He somewhat playfully said, "Holy Father, why do you get that special chair?" The group chuckled nervously at my friend's audacious chide.

The following year, the group was invited to return. They entered the room to find only simple chairs placed in a circle. Pope Francis entered, sat down in one of the humble chairs and, looking directly at my friend, with a twinkle in his eye, asked, "What do you think of my chair now?" My friend was stunned that the Pope remembered his concerns — and took the time to answer them.

Thomas the apostle was certainly stunned by the Risen Jesus displaying his wounds in person. But he also must have been equally shocked that Jesus knew and answered his particular questions, worries, and even demands related to his faith. How humbled — and perhaps a bit terrified — he must have been to realise God remembers his concerns and cares enough to answer them.

What questions or demands about Jesus do you find in your heart? Like Thomas, will you be bold enough to voice them this week? How wonderful to know that if we do so, God will remember and respond even to our most audacious desires.

Te Reo Māori in the Mass 7 April 2024

We are working our way through the Penitential Rite, today addressing the phrase "in what I have done" which is

rendered as "kua mahia ahau," in Te Reo Māori.

The word **'kua'** is a tense marker which identifies the action of the verb as currently in progress or recently completed.

In this instance, the verb is 'mahi' which is often translated as 'to work'. It also carries the sense of to do, to make, or to accomplish. The word 'mahi' appears in the phrase in its past tense: 'mahia', i.e., equivalent to the English 'done'. We have seen in earlier instalments that the word 'ahau' is a personal pronoun meaning I or me. Notice that once again, in Te Reo Māori the verb phrase 'kua mahia' precedes the subject 'ahau', the reverse of English grammar.

The relatively succinct phrase – 'in what I have done' – is followed by the somewhat more elaborate phrase 'and in what I have failed to do'. That phrase will introduce us to negation. We will address that next week.
