

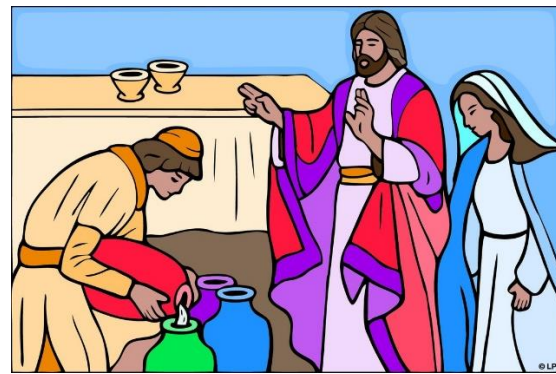

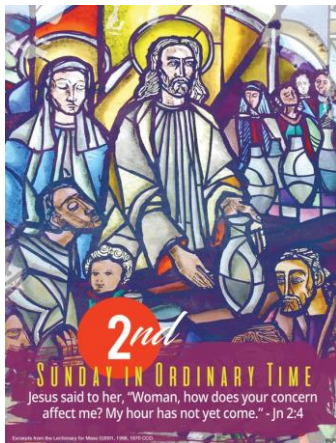

Happy new year. A short newsletter this week.



I hope with this lovely weather you have had time to stop, breath and enjoy some peaceful time.

I was lucky enough to get away for a few days to Nelson and spend time with Kev, my mum, my brother and his wife and some of our children. It was lovely to get away and see 2022 in with family.

2022 seems like we are going to be faced with more disturbances with Omicron possibly breaking past our borders. It is extremely important that we keep ourselves as safe as possible while at Mass.

We therefore want to remind you that when you attend any of the Masses you must.

- Scan in using the QR tracer app.
- Wear a face mask while in the Church.
- If you have an exemption from wearing a mask, please wear proof of this so those around you feel comfortable.
- Sanitise your hands
- Social distance if you are at a Mass for no vaccine pass required and book into this through the office.
- Show your vaccine pass if you are at a vaccine pass required Mass.

We will continue to offer weekday Masses Tuesday to Friday at 9:30am. Please remember these Masses are for non vaccine pass people and vaccine pass people.

On Saturday at 4pm we will offer a non-vaccine pass required Mass with a limit of 50 people. You must book in through the office to attend this Mass and if there are more than 50 people registered you will not be permitted to attend and will be notified of this.

The 6pm Saturday Vigil Mass and the 9:30am Sunday morning Mass are both vaccine pass required Masses. We can have unlimited numbers at these and you must show proof of vaccine to attend.

The Cardinal and the Bishops will be reviewing how we celebrate Masses at the end of this month, and as soon as we have updated information we will let you know.



The new rules around attending any of the Masses has meant a big increase in jobs required.

Last year, a few people picked up a lot of these jobs but as you can imagine, come the end of the year we were all exhausted.

As this seems to be our new world, we desperately need you to help us and volunteer for some of these jobs.

I am asking those who attend the non-vaccine pass Mass to help by cleaning the church after it, and they have been great at responding yes, but we are very short of people to.

- Clean church after non-vaccine pass Masses or just prior to the 6pm Mass.
- Verify people as they enter the Church for vaccine pass masses.
- Run the data desk – training given – all ages can do this.

We are taking enrolments for the 2022 programme. Please email the office if you wish your child to be enrolled.

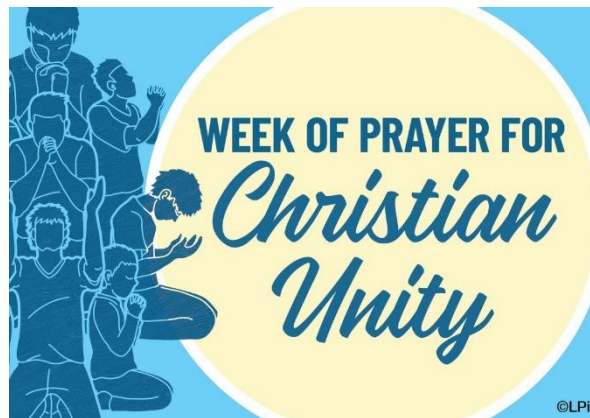
